Implementation Plan		
Model	Prompt	Check
<p>Before reading the story, the teacher should set out the expectations for the class. The teacher should tell the class to raise their hands if they have a question or if they want to answer a question. Explain and show the children how to raise their hands, keep their lips closed, and have their hands in their laps. Tell them not to say anything until their name is said. Practice this skill with a behavioral run through. Have the kids demonstrate one by one how they do it. For visual learners have a picture of a child correctly raising their hand.</p>	<p>As you read through the story and after the story, ask questions. Before asking the question, tell the class that you are going to ask one. Tell them "I have a question" and remind them "If you know the answer, raise your hand". Prompt them by raising your hand and putting your finger over you lip. They will probably need a reminder to wait until you call their name.</p>	<p>The check for this skill is generalization. It is important to make sure the child is making progress toward the goal and is able to raise their hand and wait their turn because this is turn increases their ability to follow rules of conversation and in the classroom. Children should need less and less prompting over several weeks. If they are not gaining the skill, make sure to continue to model the desired behavior. This is a skill that takes time to learn and is continued to be worked on into kindergarten.</p>
